Introduction

This list is provided by the NPSS as a public service; it may not be complete and is not meant to be an endorsement of any particular organization.

How to Use this List

The first part of this list contains supplies of native plants and seeds listed in alphabetical order. After this section, a list of suppliers of other services related to native habitats is provided. A supplier index is listed after this

section, where suppliers are ordered by alphabetical order and have a corresponding supplier code number and product abbreviation (either “s” for seed or “p” for plant). This supplier code and product abbreviation can be found in brackets after each supplier listed in the first section of this list. The last section of this list is an appendix of species sold by the suppliers listed. If you want to find sources for a specific species, use the index to find it. If it’s listed, it will have the supplier codes listed after it and whether they sell seeds (s) or plants (p). With this information, you can simply look up the supplier’s contact information in the first section of this list using their supplier code.

Please note: species are listed by their more familiar scientific names for ease of reference; some species have been renamed as a result of recent genetic testing.
